



### **ABOUT THE FOUNDATION**

The Foundation aims to raise funds to promote the work of TWC in three targeted areas:

To provide access to excellent education for deserving girls from disadvantaged backgrounds.

To provide bursaries for daughters and granddaughters of Old Girls who would otherwise not be able to attend TWC.

To develop outstanding facilities to provide the basis for the provision of world class education for girls at TWC.

### COMMUNITY OUTREACH AT THE WYKEHAM COLLEGIATE

TWC offers our pupils opportunities to make a positive contribution to the lives of those less fortunate. We participate in various community outreach activities which are designed to uplift the educational and social standards of disadvantaged children. These activities include weekly peer tutoring; a reading and writing programme; and imparting computer and mathematical skills.

The President's Award Programme enables our pupils to spend part of their holidays in rural communities, socially interacting with children and playing games and music.

Our pupils teach their peers Grade 12 subjects and aim to improve debating and public speaking skills. They are also involved in renovating classrooms and planting food gardens.

TWC has Junior and Senior Interact Clubs as well as a Grade 12 Community Service Committee which organise regular outreach projects including recycling, Easter egg drives and blanket and clothing drives. Throughout the year, the girls visit children's wards in hospitals, orphanages, homes for the aged and the SPCA. They also support various charities.

All girls are encouraged to give of their time to contribute to the community in which they live as we are keenly aware of the benefits not only to the community, but to each of our girls.
